AWARENESS MONTH

This month, let's spread the message: Schedule your mammogram. Encourage others. Together, we can save lives.

Every October, communities across the country recognize Breast Cancer Awareness Month—a time to support survivors, remember loved ones, and take steps toward prevention.

One of the most important actions women can take is scheduling an annual mammogram. Mammograms can detect breast cancer early, often before symptoms appear, and when treatment is most effective.

Who should get screened?

- Women age 40 and older should have yearly mammograms.
- Women with higher risk factors (family history, genetic risk, etc.) may need to start earlier—talk with your healthcare provider.

Why it matters:

- Early detection saves lives.
- Regular screenings give peace of mind.
- Encouraging friends and family to stay up to date with their health helps protect our entire community.

Other recommended vaccinations should be discussed with a Primary Care Physician.

Flu season starts in October, with the peak between December and February. The CDC recommends an annual flu vaccine for everyone six months of age and older. Call the Member Service Department 312-423-4200 x7997 to schedule your annual flu vaccination.
